In 1991, three city managers from Alhambra, Monrovia and West Covina recognized the need for a regional entity for the purpose of advocating, marketing, and expanding the economic base of the San Gabriel Valley. These city managers and several private sector business leaders came together to create the San Gabriel Valley Commerce and Cities Consortium to leverage the power of the region and to promote the valley.

A few years later in 1998, the group's name was changed to the San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership to reflect the growing and broad membership including business, local government, colleges and universities and non-profit organizations committed to the mission of advancing the economic vitality and quality of life of the San Gabriel Valley.

Since that time, we have strived to advance the region as an economic, logistic, educational, medical, manufacturing, and cultural hub of Southern California.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

ABOUT THE CONSORTIUM

The K12 Foothill Consortium—representing Azusa, Charter Oak, Duarte, and Monrovia Unified School Districts—delivers robust Career Technical Education (CTE) programs that prepare high school students for high-demand industries including medical pathway programs, computer science, and engineering.

Over 70% of students in the program are socioeconomically disadvantaged, and many are first-generation college-bound youth. Despite these challenges, together, we are making a measurable impact year over year.

VENTURE VALLEY FINANCIAL LITERACY TOURNAMENT AT MONROVIA HIGH SCHOOL

On September 13, 2024, Monrovia High School students showcased their financial literacy skills at the Wildcats Biz Battle, a CTE-aligned tournament hosted in partnership with Venture Valley and the Singleton Foundation. All participating students downloaded the Venture Valley app and were encouraged to practice in advance of game day. Students competed in a real-world financial decision-making game in a fun and competitive way.

SEIDNER'S COLLISION CENTERS

Founded in 1964, Seidner's Collision Centers is a family-owned and operated business committed to providing an "Extraordinary Repair Experience" across the San Gabriel Valley and Inland Empire.

Seidner's Collision Centers received the Excellence in

Workforce Development Award at the San Gabriel Valley Economic Partnership Awards Gala in October. Gene Lopez, Seidner's Director of Development and Training, also chairs the K12 Foothill Consortium's Automotive Technology Advisory Board.

In May 2025, the U.S. Department of Labor officially approved a Collision Apprenticeship in partnership with Seidner's Collision Centers—creating a local earn-and-learn pathway for individuals 18 and older with a driver's license who are interested in a career in collision repair.

PERATON DSN MURAL REVEAL

CTE mural interns were celebrated at Peraton DSN in Monrovia on October 24, 2024, for their restoration of the site's outdoor mural visible from Shamrock Avenue. This hands-on learning project was a partnership between Peraton DSN, Dionysus Creative, and the K12 Foothill Consortium.

Students received professional training in color theory and mural restoration from Dionysus Creative, while Peraton DSN provided industry context, including a tour of JPL and the mural's historical significance. Students, families, school board members, and key community stakeholders gathered to honor the interns' work. This collaborative project is a powerful example of education and industry coming together to build community pride and career readiness.

California High-Speed Rail Career Exploration

In February 2025, thirty-seven engineering students from across the Consortium participated in a two-day immersive experience exploring careers in transportation. This included



a visit to Fresno State's Lyles College of Engineering, as well as a visit to the California High-Speed Rail Authority Central Office, followed by active construction site tours—including a thrilling climb up the 65-foot Cedar Viaduct.

AWE Conference: Augmented Reality and Innovation

In June 2025, in partnership with California High-Speed Rail, Dionysus Creative, and Leonardo's Apprentice, our interns developed a cutting-edge innovation project that includes:

- Designing a VR trade show exhibit
- Fabricating a mock-up train car
- Telling the story of high-speed rail through immersive media

This collaborative exhibit will debut at LA Train Fest at Union Station in September 2025 and later be featured at the iconic Philippe's Restaurant in Downtown LA.

K12 FOOTHILL CONSORTIUM PODCAST LAUNCH

Hosted by Amy Foell, Workforce Development Consultant, our podcast features local champions and changemakers who are helping move the workforce development needle in the San Gabriel Valley.

SUMMER 2025 CTE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Now in its fifth year, the K12 Foothill Consortium Summer Internship Program continues to provide high-quality career experiences to students in grades 10–12. A heartfelt thank you to our school partners, families, educators, and amazing host organizations for supporting this transformational work. This year is our largest cohort to date with 88 student interns gaining invaluable employment training and exposure.

This summer also features an innovative cross-disciplinary internship combining carpentry, computer science, engineering, and digital media. Students will collaborate on an augmented reality exhibit for L.A. Train Fest 2025, showcasing the powerful future of transportation and technology through youth-led creativity.





ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

From its inception in the early 1990s, the Partnership has been dedicated to improving the economic vitality of the San Gabriel Valley.



ECONOMIC & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

For over 30 years, the Partnership's focus has been on building the economic development of our 31 cities. New initiatives have pushed this forward: our Leadership Academy for new city council members and staff (page 18), and the launch of a series of "Cities and Businesses Connect" events, which bring developers into direct contact with cities to explore immediate development needs and opportunities. Look for expansive ways to get involved in 2025-2026.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BEST PRACTICES

On September 3, 2024, we hosted an Economic Development Best Practices Session focused on "Innovative Real Estate Strategies & Tactics to Jumpstart Your Economy". This session featured Jennifer McLain Hiramoto of the Ontario Economic Development Agency and Chair of the California Association for Local Economic Development (CALED) Board of

Directors. McLain Hiramoto outlined progressive strategies the City of Ontario has used to rejuvenate its downtown and other crucial sectors. This was followed by a special session on CALED Training Resources and their ACE Accreditation Program.

ECONOMIC & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Over the past year, the merger of the Partnership's Economic and Workforce Development Committees has become an evident necessity. A new Workforce and Economic Development Committee, co-chaired by Angela Bernacki (Emanate Health), Dr. Salvatrice Cummo (Pasadena City College), Ken Lee (Pacific Plaza Premier Development Group), and David Klug (City of Pasadena), launched on November 14, 2024.

International Council of Shopping Centers Conference

May 19 through 21, 2025, the Partnership supported our member cities with a booth at the largest retail conference in the United States, offering a space where cities could meet with potential investors.

2025 SGV ECONOMIC FORECAST SUMMIT

On the morning of March 20, 2025, the Partnership continued our proud tradition of hosting a deep dive into our regional economy. Business leaders from across Los Angeles County came together for an up-to-the-minute discussion. A sold-out room enjoyed insights into the local economy by Dr. Gerd Welke and Dr. Anthony Orlando of Cal Poly Pomona's College of Business Administration.

This year's forecast was generously hosted by City of Industry at the Industry Hills Expo Center.

The Forecast was held at a tumultuous time, as the region was still reeling from the Eaton Fire that had left many without shelter in Altadena and Pasadena. California State Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara fielded audience questions and held a fireside chat led by the Partnership's Chair, Dr. Salvatrice Cummo of Pasadena City College.

The packed morning also included a panel discussion on "The Road to the Future San Gabriel Valley". Panelists included Stephen Cheung, Los Angeles Economic Development Corporation; Jennifer Ferrara, Avanade; Todd R. Moore, Hahn & Hahn LLP; and Partnership Board Member Lei Wang of Gemdale U.S.A.

SGV REGIONAL LEADERSHIP **A**CADEMY

Late Spring 2025 launched the inaugural San Gabriel Valley Regional Leadership Academy, a specialized program designed to help senior to mid-level city staff and publicprivate business partners understand key economic sectors and how they impact the region. This colorful, monthly program visits sites where participants see what makes the San Gabriel Valley work.

The initial sessions in Q4 2025 included an onsite visit to Pasadena City Hall and Doheny Eye Institute, an example of economic development success in Pasadena's quest for expanding its presence in biosciences.

Our second session took place at the Southern California Edison Substation in Monterey Park, where experts from SCE and the California Energy Storage Alliance discussed the logistics of energy supply to SGV businesses and homes, and how these concerns affect policy and consumer needs. As of July 2025, four additional sessions are planned for the first round, with a second session in 2026.


"Measure A" Information Session
